



What is Transitional Kindergarten?



- Transitional kindergarten is defined as "the first year of a two-year kindergarten program that uses a modified kindergarten curriculum that is <u>age</u> and developmentally appropriate" (Education Code Section 48000[d]).
- Transitional kindergarten offers children with birthdays between September 2nd and December 1st a developmentally appropriate curriculum <u>aligned with kindergarten standards</u>, taught by credentialed teachers.

Camarena TK Curriculum



- Transitional Kindergarten students do not experience two years of traditional kindergarten. They participate in a developmentally appropriate <u>educational</u> <u>experience</u> based on the California Preschool Learning Foundations and California's Common Core Standards for kindergarten.
- Positive early relationships are vital to the foundation of healthy development and greatly influence a child's ability to achieve later in life (Cohen, Onunaku, Clothier, & Poppe, 2005).

Reading Goals for TK

Print Concepts – understands the organization and features of print (top to bottom, left to right)

Phonological Awareness – hearing sounds in speech for rhyming and sound manipulation.

Letters and Sounds – (Alphafriends CD & mat).

Phonics – letter/sound relationships to blend,

segment, and read words.

Sight Words – memorize 25 most common words by "sight."


Reading Literature – characters, setting, major events, author and illustrator's role, compare and contrast stories.

Reading Informational Text – main topic and key defails, ask and answer questions about text.

 Books Are Treasures – year-long reading incentive program.


Writing Goals for TK

- Speak audibly and clearly and produce complete sentences (language comes first – then writing)
- Students progress through stages of writing: pictures, labeling, letter strings, beginning sounds, final sounds, middle sounds
- Transitional writing: spell words phonetically
- Writing instruction occurs across the curriculum
- Name and use end punctuation




Math Goals for TK

- Identify numbers 1-10
- Count to 30
- 1:1 Correspondence up to 10
- Compare numbers: more, less, equal
- Identify and describe shapes (squares, circles, triangles, rectangles, hexagons)
- Calendar Math (purpose of calendar)
- Patterning: AB, ABC, AABB, etc.



Science & Social Studies

- Being a good citizen
- Community workers and helpers
- Five Senses: sight, smell, hear, touch, taste
- Parts of the Body
- Healthy Foods
- Weather and seasons
- Multi-Cultural Traditions
- Famous Artists
- Life cycle of plants, e.g. pumpkins
- Animal movements, body parts, and classes: mammals, fish, birds, reptiles, amphibians, insects

- Teachers monitor student progress via routine assessments

Behavior Support System

We believe in positive reinforcement and appropriate consequences. Follow through at home makes the classroom management system more meaningful and effective.
